RECOGNITIONS

Three UT Knoxville faculty members have been named as the latest group of James R. Cox University Professors. The group includes **Angela Batey**, associate professor of music; **Louis J. Gross**, professor of mathematics and ecology and evolutionary biology; and **Donald Hodges**, professor of forestry, wildlife and fisheries. Each professorship lasts three years and includes a stipend of \$25,500 to be used at the recipients' discretion.

Thomas E. Burman, professor and head of the history department, is the 2008 recipient of the American Philosophical Society's Jacques Barzun Prize in Cultural History. The prize was in recognition of his book *Reading the Qur'an in Latin Christendom, 1140-1560*.

Ramon P. DeGennaro, professor of banking and finance, recently presented his paper "The Expected Returns to Angel Investments" with Gerald P. Dwyer of the Federal Reserve Bank of Atlanta at the Ewing Marion Kauffman Foundation in Kansas City, Missouri. DeGennaro also presented his paper "Syndicates' Choices under Different Payoff Distributions" with Ann B. Gillette of Kennesaw State University at the Symposium on Gambling, Prediction Markets and Public Policy at Nottingham Trent University in Nottingham, UK.

Jan King, regional coordinator for the College of Social Work Office of Research and Public Service (SWORPS), was presented the Outstanding Member Award by the Tennessee Association for the Education of Young Children (TAEYC) at the organization's 2008 state conference in Nashville.

Leon Tolbert, Min H. Kao Professor in Electrical Engineering and Computer Science, gave an invited talk titled, "Silicon Carbide's Potential Impact on the Design of Wind Generation Systems" during the 1st Annual Symposium on Grid Integration of Wind Power held in Aalborg, Denmark. Tolbert is an International Advisory Board Member for Aalborg University's Vestas Power Program, a strategic research and development alliance between Vestas Wind Systems and Aalborg University's Department of Energy Technology.
